

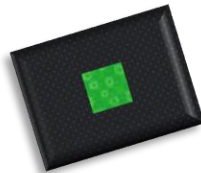
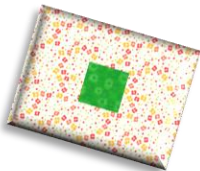

Scrappy Quilt Fabric Requirements and Cutting Instructions



Lap Size Cutting Instructions

Scrappy Colors

2 ½" squares – 194

2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles - 4

Light or Dark Background - approx. 3.5 yards using 2 ½" strips

2 ½" squares – 54

2 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles - 48

2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles –54

2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles – 54

2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles – 88

Fabric requirements based on 2 ½" strips. You may be able to get away with less if you cut strips the larger size and subcut into 2 ½" units, as well as using leftovers strips before cutting more.

NOTE:

To give you an idea, you can get approximately 56 squares (2 ½") from a Fat Quarter.

But remember that the more variety you have, the better outcome you have....unless you are going to do a controlled scrappy. If you want to control, then have at least 6 different fabrics (there are 6 scrappy colors in the main block)

I used about 30 different colors, and I still had some areas that I had to tweak, so the same fabric/color wasn't together. The more variety, the better

2 ½" squares – 320

2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles - 4

Light or Dark Background - approx. 6 yards using 2 ½" strips

2 ½" squares – 88

2 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles - 68

2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles –88

2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles – 88

2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles – 139

Inside Border:

2 ½" strips – 4

3 ½" strips - 4

Directions are divided up according to size. Look at the top of the page to ensure you are following the correct ones.

Scrappy Quilt Tips and Hints



When working with scrappy patterns here are a couple of things to keep in mind.

- Try not to use the same color next to each other, even better not to use the same color in the same block.
- Try to vary colors in each section – for example try not to always put a blue in the left corner of each block.
- I go with the “grab a color out of a bag and use it” method with only one rule: put it back if it is the same as another color in the block. You may need to be fussier the further along in the process you get.
- The more variety of Scrappy Colors, the easier it is and the less likely to have the same Scrappy Color together.

Need more ideas?

- Take a few minutes ahead of time to play around with possible designs. Blank layouts are in your retreat packet.

Not only do you have color placement options, but block layout options. Play with the layout before you sew your blocks into rows.

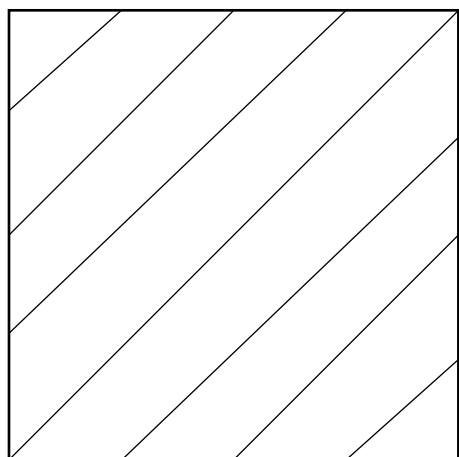
Need some layout ideas?

Line up for scrappy colors diagonally – so this means using the same scrappy colors in the block.

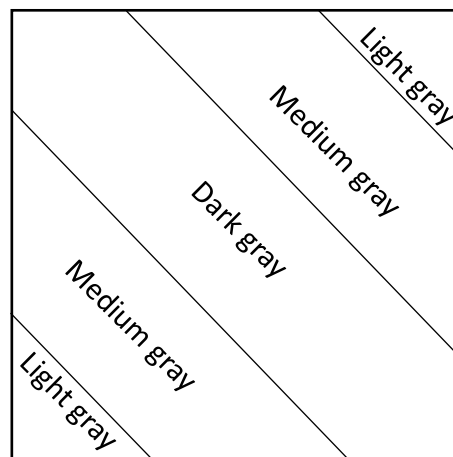
You will need to plan your blocks ahead of time – use the blanks to color in what color goes where.

Instead of using all light or dark background fabrics, use a light med and dark of a neutral – black, brown, etc.

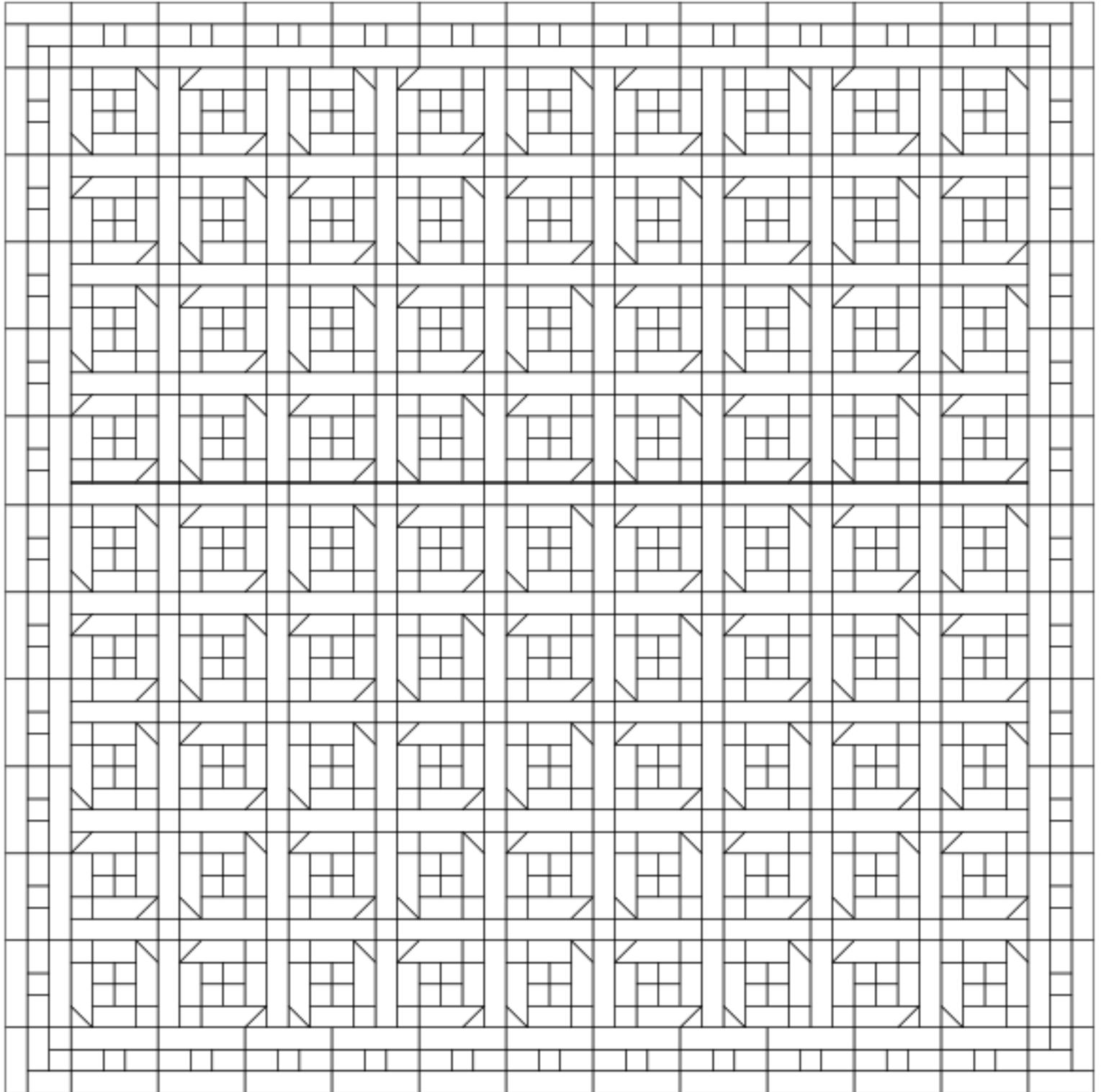
You can still go random scrappy with the other colors, but have the Background layout planned.



If you really want to mix it up (or make it more challenging) – combine both of these methods!

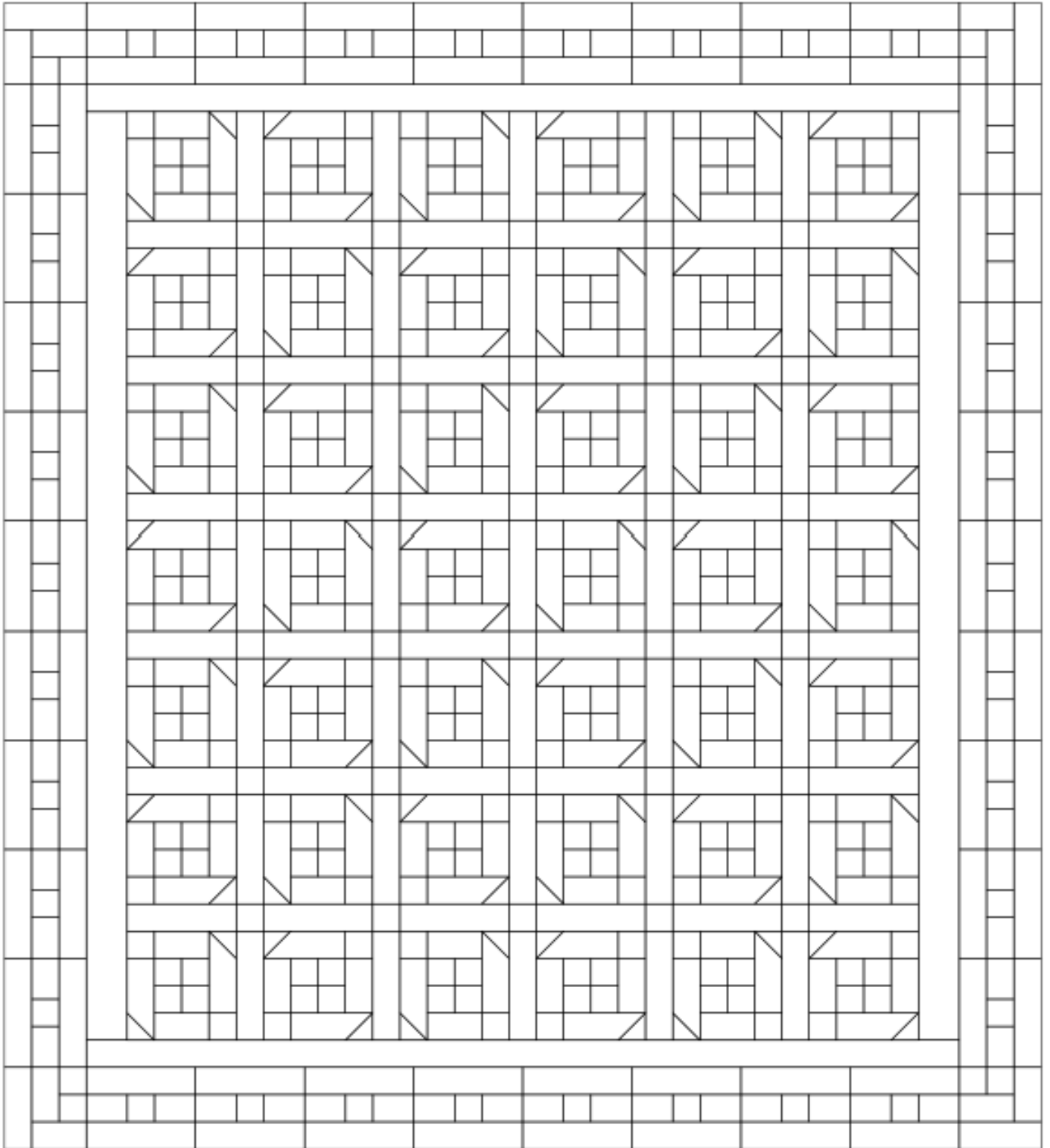

Options

Use all the same color for the background. If your scrappy colors are more medium colors – choose a dark for the background. Black will give it a more traditional Amish look.

Don't forget to check out a Dark Brown. This would work for a more rustic or masculine décor.

You can also make this a two color quilt (ex. Blue & White): either go scrappy or buy yardage for both colors.

If you want to use pre-cut bundles for the Scrappy Colors, here is the basic break down:

Mini Charms (2 ½")– each mini is already cut to size, so you need 590 minis as well as 4 rectangles that measure 2 ½" x 4 ½"

Charms (5") – each one will give you 4 pieces, you will need 148 Charms plus 4 rectangles

Jolly Bar (5" x 10")– Each one will give you 8 pieces, you will need about 75 Jolly Bars plus rectangles

Layer Cake (10" x 10")– each one will give you 16 pieces, you will need 37 Layer Cakes plus rectangles

Jelly Roll (2 ½" x 42")– each one will give you 16 pieces, you will need 37 Jelly Rolls plus rectangles

Fat Quarters (18" x 20")– each one will give you 56 squares, you will need 11 to 12. For a scrappier look, use more Fat Quarters

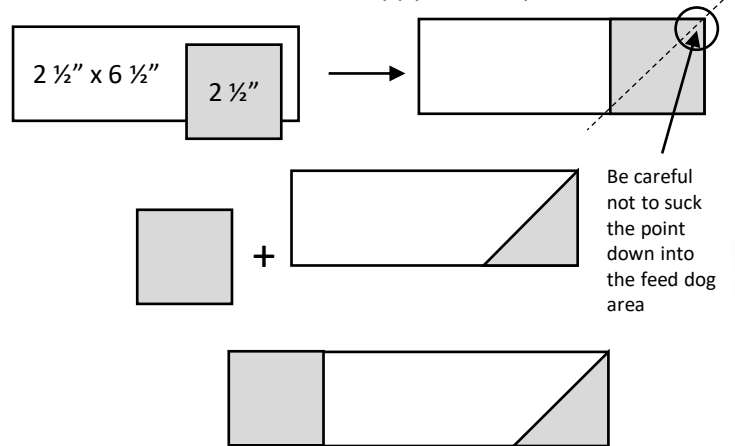
Step One: Create 4-Patches with Scrappy Colors (gray squares) and Light Backgrounds



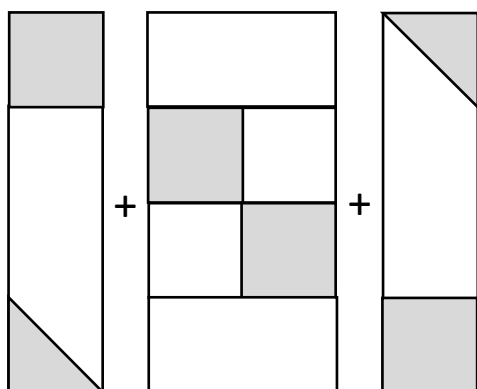
Step Two: Add Background rectangles to the top and bottom of the 4-Patch. Press seam allowance toward the background.



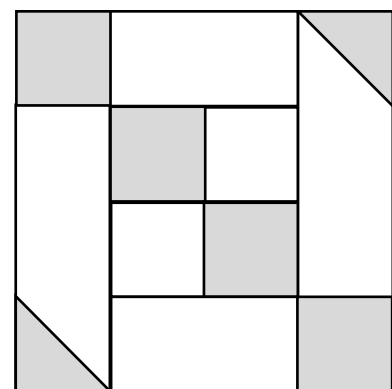
Step Three: Add Scrappy Color square to a Light Background rectangle as shown. Pay attention to the orientation. Add a Scrappy Color square as shown.



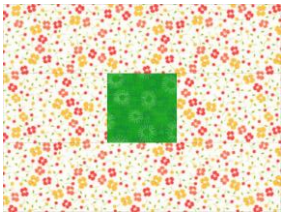
Step Four: Add Step Three units to Step Two units as shown in the diagram.



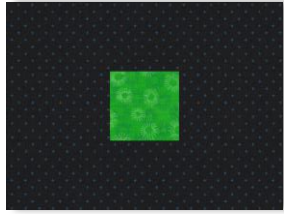

Use all the same color for the background. If your scrappy colors are more medium colors – choose a dark for the background. Black will give it a more traditional Amish look.

You can also make this a two color quilt (ex. Blue & White): either go scrappy or buy yardage for both colors.

If you want to use pre-cut bundles for the Scrappy Colors, here is the basic break down:

Mini Charms (2 ½")– each mini is already cut to size, so you need 290 minis as well as 4 rectangles that measure 2 ½" x 4 ½"

Charms (5") – each one will give you 4 pieces, you will need 73 Charms plus the 4 rectangles

Jolly Bar (5"x10")– Each one will give you 8 pieces, you will need about 37 Jolly Bars plus the 4 rectangles

Layer Cake (10"x10")– each one will give you 16 pieces, you will need 19 Layer Cakes plus the rectangles

Jelly Roll (2 ½" x 42")– each one will give you 16 pieces, you will need 19 Jelly Rolls plus the rectangles

Fat Quarters (18" x 20")– each one will give you 56 squares, you will need 6. For a scrappier look, use more Fat Quarters

Jelly Roll (2 ½" x 42") – each one will give you 16 pieces, you will need 13 Jelly Rolls, plus the rectangles

Fat Quarters (18" x 20") – each one will give you 56 squares, you will need 4. For a scrappier look, use more Fat Quarters

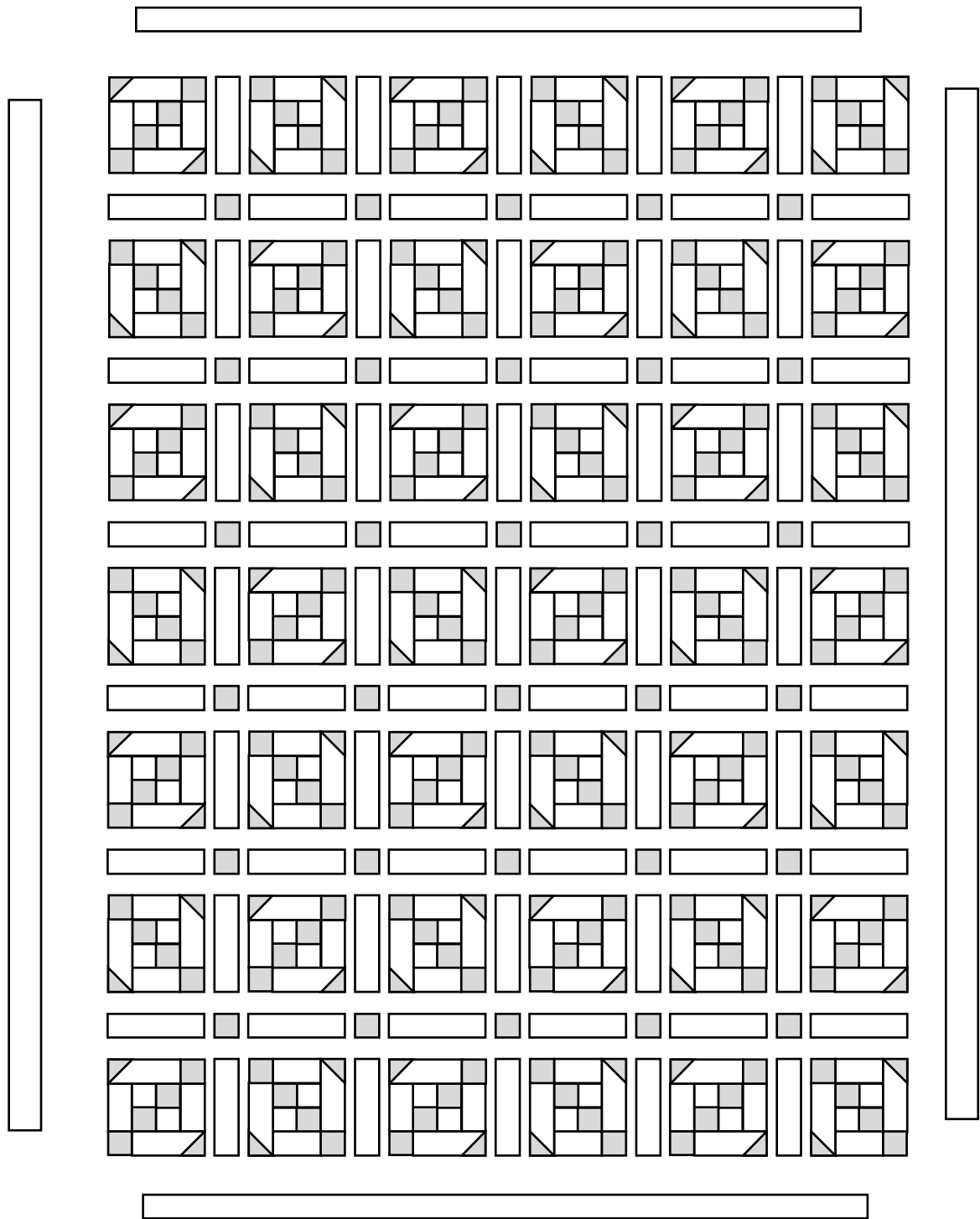
Sashings and Cornerstones

King Size – This is just one layout possibility. Take a couple minutes to test out other options.



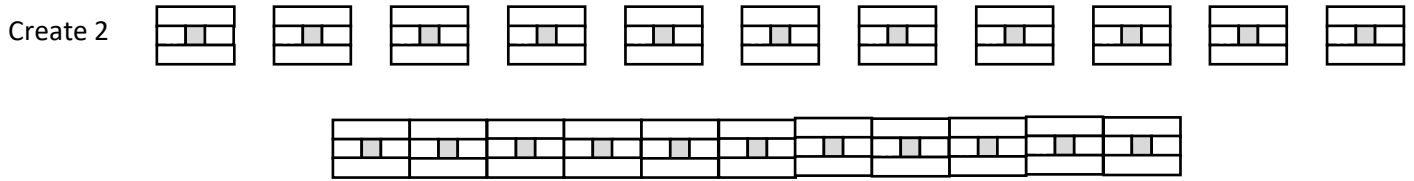

Once you have your quilt center done – an inner border needs to be added so your pieced border blocks fit correctly. The narrow border will go on the top and bottom. The wider border will go on the sides.



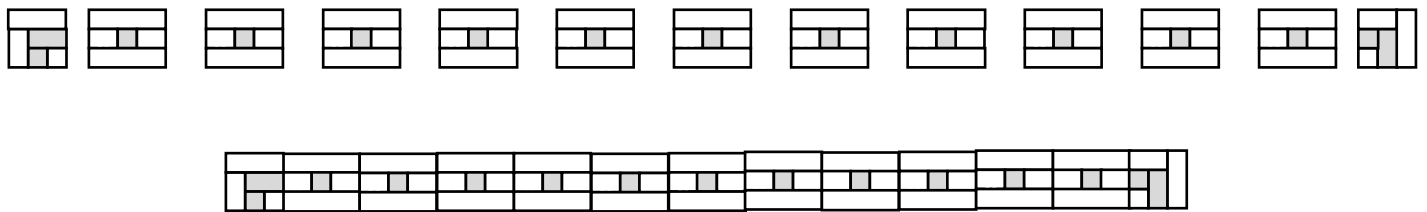
