

## Row Eleven Ohio Star Blocks

You'll need the following to create 12 Ohio Star Blocks:

Background

2" x 3 1/2" rectangles – 48

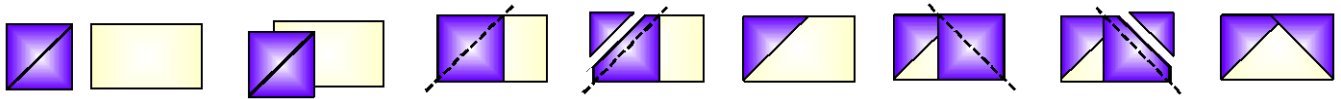
2" squares – 48

Scrappy - (I am using 6 colors)

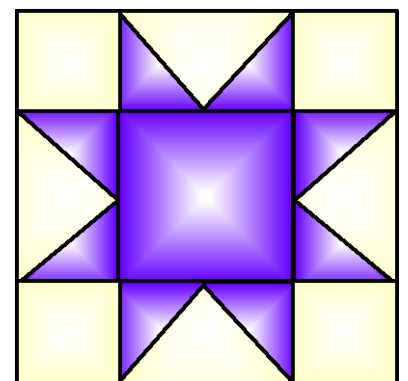
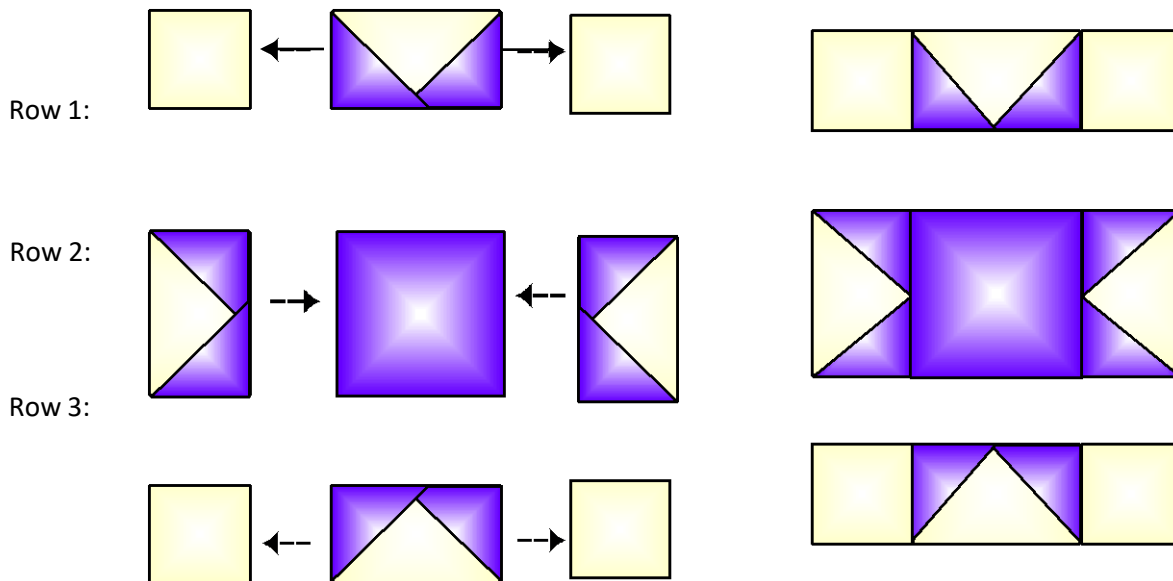
2" squares - 96 (16 of each color)

3 1/2" squares - 12 (2 of each color)

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Background squares. Layer a Background square on the Scrappy color squares, as shown in the diagrams. Sew on the diagonal line. Trim 1/4" from the diagonal line toward the outside corner. Press seam allowance toward the Background fabric. Repeat the process on the other corner, as shown in the diagram. Create 48 Flying Geese blocks (8 in each color combination) measuring 2" x 3 1/2".

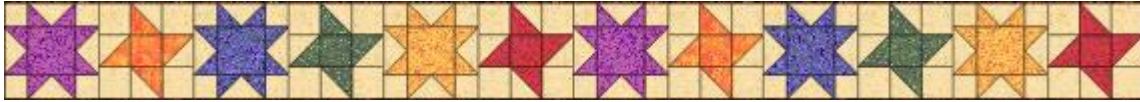


Sew the units together to create block rows. Press the seam allowance in the direction of the arrows. Sew the rows together to create the block. Press the seam allowance to the side. Create 12 Ohio Star blocks measuring 6 1/2".



## Options for the layout of the last two rows.

Because the last two rows are stars and are at the top of the quilt, I switched things up on my quilt and alternated the Friendship Star and the Ohio Star to give the quilt a bit more “sparkle”.



You can also choose to complete the last two rows like you did the rows before. Both options look great in a finished quilt.
