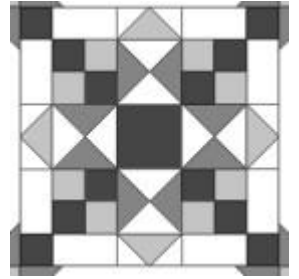


July 2026 Block of the Month



You'll need the following:

Background

2" x 3 1/2" rectangles – 8

4 1/2" squares – 2 (draw a diagonal line on the wrong side)

Color #1

2" squares – 8

2" x 3 1/2" rectangle - 4

Color #2

4 1/2" squares – 2

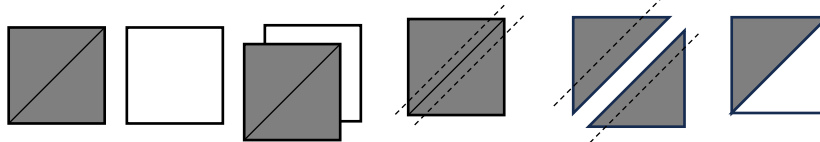
Color #3

2" squares – 12

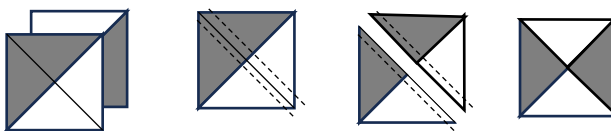
3 1/2" square - 1

Creating Quarter Square Triangles

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 4 1/2" background squares. Layer a Color #2 square with a background square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" from the diagonal line, on both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the diagonal line. Carefully press the seam allowance toward the Color #2 fabric. Create 4 HST units.



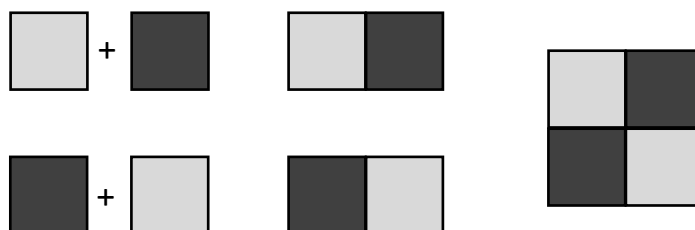
Separate the HST's into groups as shown below. Draw diagonal lines on the wrong side of half of the HST's. Make sure you use the opposite diagonal as shown in the diagram. Layer the HST's with lines on the HST's without lines, right sides together and opposite colors facing. Sew 1/4" from the diagonal line on both sides of the line. Cut apart on the diagonal line. Press carefully to the side.



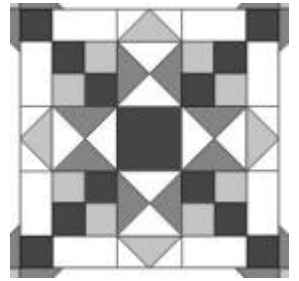
Create 4 and trim to 3 1/2" square. For best results, trim from all 4 sides of the QST.

Creating 4-Patches

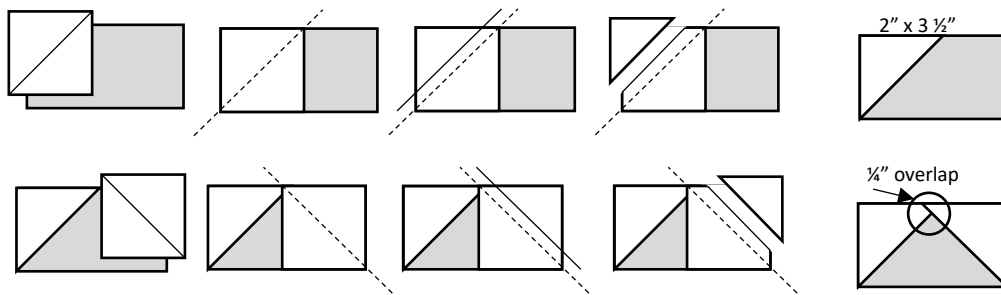
You will be using the 2" Color # 1 squares and the 2" Color #3 squares to create 4-Patches. Match one of each squares and sew down the edge. Press the seam allowance toward Color #3. The 2-patches should measure 2" x 3 1/2". Create 8 2-patches. Sew the 2-patches together with the Color #3 opposite the Background color. The 4-patches should measure 3 1/2". Create 4.

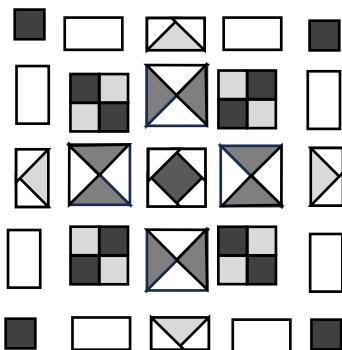


Layer Background 2" square on the Color #1 2" x 3 1/2" rectangle right sides together, as shown in the diagram. Pay attention to the direction of the drawn line. Sew on the drawn line. Trim 1/4" from the line toward the outside corner. Carefully press the Background piece toward the outside without stretching it. Repeat on the other corner as shown in the diagram. Pay close attention to the direction you are sewing that second square. Create 4 flying geese measuring 2" x 3 1/2".

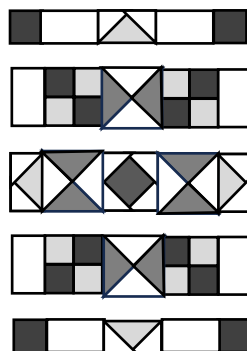


Layout the units as shown in Step 1 below. Sew the rows together as shown in Step 2. This is the first block where the outside block border is a pieced one. Pay close attention to the orientation of the units. Sew the rows together as shown in Step 3. Press the seam allowance to the side. Your block should measure 12 1/2".
